The Division was formed in 1923 in Kaluga in the Moscow Military District initially as a territorial Rifle Division. It remained there until 1924/25 when it was transferred to the Byelorussian Military District. In September 1939, it was mobilized and transferred to the Kiev Special Military District where it was assigned to the 8th Rifle Corps, 5th Army to take part in the invasion of Poland. It remained in the western Ukraine until January 1940 when by order of the People's Commissariat for Defense (Order No. 4/2/103005 dated 31 December 1939) it was ordered to reorganize into a Motorized Division.

### **2nd Formation:**

The Division was formed on 29 July 1941 by the official re-designation of the 81st Motorized Division into the 81st Rifle Division, although this had been a reality for a few weeks. At this time, it was in Front Reserves, trying to get its act together through its reorganization. It was finally sent to the front line at the end of September 1941. But by this time it was to rebuild what was left of the Southwestern Front after being encircled at Kiev. It remained with the 21st Army until the Spring of 1942 when it was transferred to the 38th Army. It remained there until June when it was further south to help rebuild the 9th Army after Khar'kov. The 9th Army took the full force of the German summer offensive. It retreated all the way back to the southern part of the Don River. There Stavka decided that the 9th Army was too week to be much good so it decided to reorganize it. First, it ordered that all of its forces be transferred to the 37th Army, then moved the headquarters to Vladikavkaz in the Caucasus. Unfortunately it was determined, probably by the 37th Army commander, that the 81st Division was too weak to rebuild, so he ordered it disbanded. It took over a month for the paperwork get to the General Staff and gain their approval. The Division was officially disbanded on 27 September 1942.

#### **3rd Formation:**

The Division was formed on 13 October 1942 by the reorganization and expansion of the 135th Rifle Brigade (I Formation), which at the time was assigned to the Bryansk Front's 48th Army. It took part in the Soviet winter offensives of 1942/43, pushing the Germans back to west of Orel. It then moved south and participated in the formation of the Kursk bulge in the late winter and its defense during the summer. After helping in the elimination of the Orel bulge, it spent some time in Stavka Reserves where it rested and regrouped. In the winter of 1943/44, it took part in the first offensives into Byelorussia, which failed. After resting again in Stavka Reserves, in the summer of 1944 it took part in the offensives in the western Ukraine and southeastern Poland. It then was transferred south to help in clearing the Carpathian mountain range and eastern Czechoslovakia. As the war was ending, it took part in the final destruction of German forces on the Eastern Front. After the war, it was ordered to disband as part of the order establishing the Northern Group of Forces (Stavka VGK Order No. 11097 dated 29 May 1945). It faded out of existence a few months later. The number was not used again for a Rifle Division.
