

It must be kept in mind that the operation, requiring the TF to be at sea for 30 days at a time, was a tremendous undertaking for the Royal Navy. Given the vast expanse of the Pacific Ocean, the USN was used to operating for 60 days without putting into a port. The RN, however, relied on a dense network of bases obtained and built during 350 years of sea superiority and then sea supremacy that covered every part of the world except the Pacific.

Given the gargantuan size of US fleets – a natural concomitant of the US's economic size, possessing a GNP greater by far than the rest of the world combined – the RN's contribution seems a mere coda. Nonetheless, considering that British global commitments and 5 ½ years of war had already stretched the RN to the very maximum possible, however symbolic, TF 57 was a gallant contribution and expression of solidarity with its much more powerful ally.


