This order of battle is by Mr. Richard Bennett. He writes:

There appear to be at least 58 reserve Infantry Units listed as Brigades; most are of battalion size or less, many are training or cadre only. Below are two lists for reserve brigade. List A contains those brigades I estimate are of large Battalion or Battalion Group in strength, and are of a standard of training and equipment to be operational within 10 days. List B contains reserve/training/cadre brigades that a mere company in strength, or at most a weak battalion.

Editor's Note: The Former Yugoslavia split into Bosnia-Herzegovina, Croatia, Macedonia, Serbia-Montenegro (the residual country of Yugoslavia), and Slovenia. Each of the five countries has its own armed forces. Complicating the picture, Bosnia-Herzegovina is itself a mini-federation of three peoples: Muslims, Croats, and Serbs, each of whom maintains their own armed forces. The Bosnian and Croat forces nominally have a joint army, but actually only one brigade is integrated and the Croats periodically threaten to pull out. Both groups work together only from fear of the Serbs, who call themselves the Provisional Republic of Srpska. The Serbs stay in Bosnia-Herzegovina only under duress of the West. The region is highly fluid: Macedonia may break up, Montenegro and Kosovo may secede, and Bosnia-Herzegovina may also break up. Even more complications are possible: for example, Srpska wants to merge with Serbia, some Macedonian Albanians want to merge with Kosovo, elements in Macedonia and Kosovo want to merge with Albania. The region could disintegrate further; at some point Serb nationalism, temporarily beaten down by a decade of war and deprivation, might revive and begin the cycle all over again. From an orbat viewpoint, this region will remain difficult to understand for non-Europeans. Because of Yugoslavia's post-World War 2 system of total defense, all these nations new and old are used to maintaining huge forces, active and reserve, in proportion to their populations.
